Manuscript Submission details

1. Manuscript submissions may be any of the article types accepted by *Integratus*; see complete list: <https://integratus.scholasticahq.com/for-authors>
2. To qualify as “student scholarship,” the following criteria need to be met:
 - a. Student is the first author on the manuscript. Professional mentors are secondary author(s).
 - i. *Integratus* adheres to the American Psychological Association ethics code (2017) and publication manual (2020) for defining authorship based on contribution. First author is the scholar that makes the most “substantial contribution to” and “takes the most responsibility for” the scholarship.
 - b. Student-author is currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program.

- i. Recognizing that scholarship takes time, the student-author may have started the manuscript while enrolled in school and may submit the manuscript up to two years post-graduation.
 - ii. Individuals that have graduated and are currently in a formal post-doctoral training program are eligible to submit their scholarship under this special call.
3. Submitted manuscripts will go through the standard review process as well as editorial overview by Jonathan Alvarado, Lizzy Engelkamp, Dr. Milo Milburn, and Dr. Anthony Isacco.
4. Manuscripts selected for publication will reflect the general standards of *Integratus* and fit with this special call.

Timeline/Deadlines

- Author(s) are encouraged to submit a preliminary abstract to *Integratus* editors, by **March 1, 2025** via email to integratus@catholicpsychotherapy.org
- Submitted abstracts should be a maximum of 500 words and include a title, author name(s) and contact information, and summary of the manuscript idea.
- Full-length manuscripts are due by **December 1, 2025** and are submitted through the standard online submission portal: <https://integratus.scholasticahq.com/>
